Scott Nanik used an interactive quiz to teach us about the scope and functions of the Calaveras County Office of Education, including local control and funding oversight of all the county's public schools. The CCOE has 150 employees, and manages the payroll for all the school employees as well.



After 15 years of declining enrollment, we have 5300 total students in the county – 23% of whom receive special education (twice the State average). More Speech Pathologists are needed to teach students with learning disabilities. For more information, sit next to Scott at an upcoming meeting!
