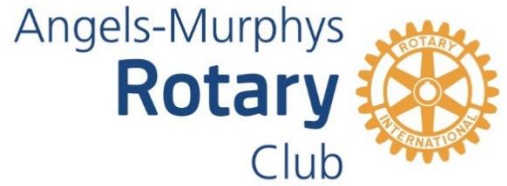

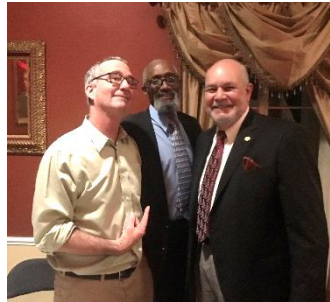

Things About Rotary: *On February 23, 1905, Paul Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in Chicago. This was the first Rotary Club meeting. They decided to call the new club "Rotary" after the practice of rotating meeting locations. Realizing Rotary needed a greater purpose beyond "friendship and fellowship", in 1907 the club initiated its first public service project, the construction of public toilets in Chicago. This step transformed Rotary into the world's first service club.*

Angels-Murphys Rotary Club holds great fundraisers so that we can do good in the community! We are proud that this small club can do so much in a year, such as:

- Award \$6000 in scholarships to graduating seniors
- Give winter coats, backpacks & school supplies to local children and illustrated dictionaries to every third grader in our district

- Collect, repair and distribute wheelchairs for the disabled poor
- Pack & ship 2000 pairs of shoes for repair by Soles4Souls
- Contribute to Rotary International's Six Areas of Focus (incl. polio)
