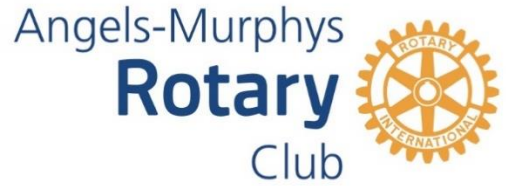

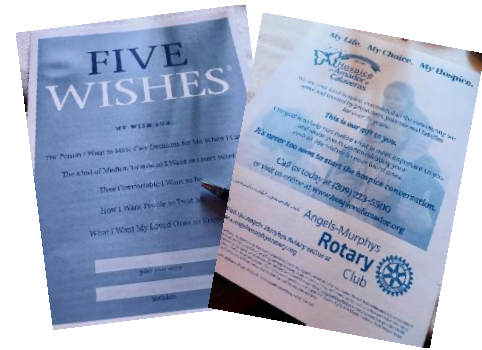
Only a bright yellow marble was Steve's reward last week. Super Pot = \$130.

Things About Rotary

THE OBJECT OF

ROTARY is "to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise." The statement then lists four areas by which this "ideal of service" is fostered: "through the development of acquaintance as the opportunity for service; the promotion of high ethical standards in business and professions; through service in one's personal, business and community life; and the advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace." This statement has been revised many times over the century since Rotary was formed. The "ideal of service" is the key phrase in the Object of Rotary. This ideal is an attitude of **being a thoughtful and helpful person in all of one's endeavors.** That's what the Object truly means.
