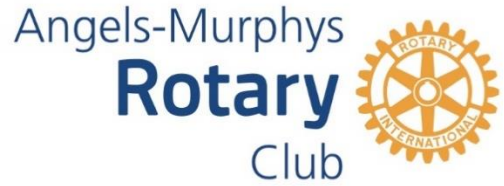

After quite a list of “on this day in history” events including FDR’s birth and Yerba Buena being renamed San Francisco, President Bert welcomed visiting Rotarian Tony Mills from Wellington Point, Australia! He’s on a western US ski & golf vacation. Dave let us know that he’ll be providing each member with their

progress reports towards their Paul Harris Fellowships. We heard that Al Armstrong is home from the hospital and recovering. We hope to see him back at the meeting soon.

MaryBeth Ospital and Dave Vacarezza were our guest speakers from Cal-Waste Recovery Systems. They have made huge progress in Calaveras County since they were brought on board in 2013 to help us come into compliance with state mandates and ease pressure on the local landfill.



They have a new \$20 million machine that sorts the recycling at 4 times the volume with half the labor. It can now sort



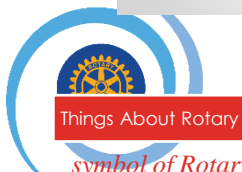
plastics 1-7. Major problems are contaminated recycling (rinse your containers before putting them in the blue bin) and plastic bags (they clog everything!). China is no longer taking material and the revenue stream to the County has dried up. Now some recycling is being sent to Indonesia, Malaysia and Mexico. Contact them for more info about what’s recyclable ... and don’t put your recycling in plastic bags!

What we do!

Angels-Murphys Rotary Club holds great fundraisers so that we can do good in the community! We are proud that this small club can do so much in a year, such as:

- Award \$5000 in scholarships to graduating seniors
- Give winter coats, backpacks & school supplies to local children and illustrated dictionaries to every third grader in our district

A WHEEL has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement." Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads. In 1922 it was decided that all clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. In 1923 the present gear wheel, with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted. A group of engineers advised that the geared wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So the keyway was added and the design which we now know was formally adopted as the official RI emblem.
