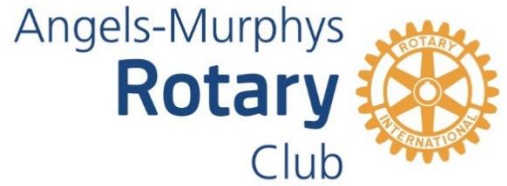

Last week we were joined by Tammy’s guest Anna and Paula’s guest Kathleen, both interested in Rotary! Jenny Baxter was officially inducted after quickly completing all her new member activities, and was pinned by her sponsor Tammy. We are happy to have her among us! Happy Bucks were flowing freely – some for Jenny joining and some more for Meryl going to

Massachusetts. Linda gave a buck for our guest speaker Dr. Bob who she knows from her Stockton days. We received a kind thank you note for the school supplies and coats, gloves, socks etc. that we donated to local kids – projects completed by Sam and Paula.

Dr. Bob Melrose gave us a very thorough explanation (with handouts so we don’t forget!) of The Rotary Foundation and how it is organized. It was started in 1927 by Arch Klumph with a donation of \$26.50 – currently it has more than \$1 billion!



Rotary members can donate to the Annual Fund, Polio Plus Fund and the Endowment. Annual Fund donations are partially returned to the District and Club which we used for Dictionaries, Coats for Kids, and a BioSand water filter project in the Philippines. Polio Plus donations are matched 2:1 by the Gates Foundation. Members earn Paul Harris Fellow designations for cumulative donations. Dr. Bob encouraged us all to consider the Bequest Society, and check your progress by logging into MyRotary.

What we do!

Angels-Murphys Rotary Club holds great fundraisers so that we can do good in the community! We are proud that this small club can do so much in a year, such as:

- Award \$5000 in scholarships to graduating seniors
- Give winter coats, backpacks & school supplies to local children and illustrated dictionaries to every third grader in our district
- Purchase, pack and deliver holiday meals to 200 families
- Send juniors to leadership camp & honor top students of all ages
- Replace wells and raise emergency funds for wildfire victims
- Construct park improvements, benches and a community garden

- Support the Senior Center’s food pantry & local Meals-on-Wheels
- Collect, repair and distribute wheelchairs for the disabled poor
- Pack & ship 2000 pairs of shoes for repair by Soles4Souls
- Contribute to Rotary International’s Six Areas of Focus (incl. polio)

Things About Rotary

How do you describe "Rotary"?

There are the activities of a million Rotarians. There are the features of service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis of high ethical standards, and concern for other people. In 1976 the Rotary International Board of Directors was interested creating a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. After numerous drafts, Rotary’s PR committee presented this definition, which has been used ever since in Rotary publications: "Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world." Those 31 words are worth remembering when someone asks, "What is a Rotary club?"
