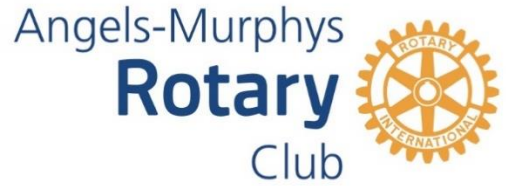

We hope you all enjoyed our long holiday break and are ready to start 2020 with a goal of doing good while having fun! Prior to the holidays we heard from Amanda Folendorf, currently Mayor of Angels Camp and candidate for Dist. 4 Supervisor. She was able to fit in a lot of information on what's happening in the City... Almost all department heads are new in the last two years, the budget has gone from a deficit to in-the-black, new tax revenue is coming in to do water infrastructure improvements, and grants of several million dollars are coming in for parks & recreation.

We had an international visitor, Luis from Ensenada Rotary, who connected with Paula to talk about potential project partnerships! Jenny Baxter received her official new member gear after reciting a perfect 4 Way Test. Dave gave us an intro of some of the areas of focus for The Rotary Foundation, to which we all contribute. Last year TRF spent \$86 million on projects worldwide! Sabrina reported that we are halfway to our "7th Meal" goal for Meals on Wheels – we need about 20 more community members to give \$219. Many happy bucks were donated – most notably from King who celebrated his 76th anniversary of Rotary membership!



What we do!

Things About Rotary: *The first Rotary club to be organized outside an English-speaking country was established in Havana, Cuba, April 29, 1916, with 22 charter members. The club was admitted to Rotary on June 1, 1916. During 1923, the Rotary Club of Havana celebrated its 7th anniversary, in what became a very busy year. The club sponsored a carnival attended by more than 1,500 children, won a prohibition against bullfighting in Cuba, worked to get the city's water sanitized and properly purified, and obtained pavement repairs in certain areas. By 1979 all 60 Cuban clubs were terminated by RI on the grounds that countries which restrict free speech and freedom of assembly could not have clubs. There is hope, as Rotary has returned to Eastern Europe and China.*

Angels-Murphys Rotary Club holds great fundraisers so that we can do good in the community! We are proud that this small club can do so much in a year, such as:

- Award \$6000 in scholarships to graduating seniors
- Give winter coats, backpacks & school supplies to local children and illustrated dictionaries to every third grader in our district
- Purchase, pack and deliver holiday meals to 200 families
- Send juniors to leadership camp & honor top students of all ages
- Replace wells and raise emergency funds for wildfire victims
- Construct park improvements, benches and a community garden
- Foster the spirit of community service in Bret Harte's Interact Club
- Support the Senior Center's food pantry & local Meals-on-Wheels
- Collect, repair and distribute wheelchairs for the disabled poor
- Pack & ship 2000 pairs of shoes for repair by Soles4Souls
- Contribute to Rotary International's Six Areas of Focus (incl. polio)
