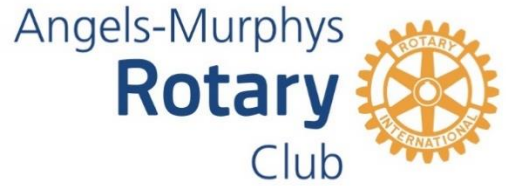

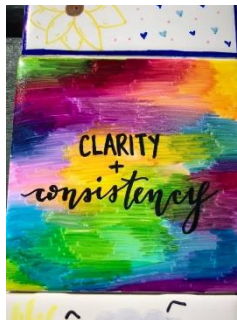

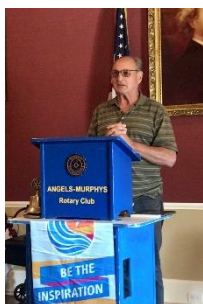

Carrie announced that our own King McPherson, whose 103rd birthday will be on St. Patrick's Day, is going to be the Grand Marshal in our Irish Day parade! were donated in celebration of King and for other things like Louie daring to drink a Corona. Our speaker Tad Folendorf has a long family history in Angels Camp. His parents came from Lodi in the 1930s and worked in public service. Tad found adventure exploring the openings and mining tunnels that extend all over town and down to Greenhorn. The mining tunnels sit right on top of the Mother Lode. The map he showed us indicates the various depths ... many have caved in and it is extremely dangerous. His family bought the Utica Mansion and restored it. He told of many later famous people (James Fair, George Hearst, James Irvine) who tried their hand at gold mining here. He told us about how they got air into the mine shafts and developed hydroelectric power for light. Mules were used to pull ore carts – many died or went blind. If you missed Tad's presentation, you missed a lot! Talk to him to learn so much more about our Gold Rush history.

Things About Rotary

AVENUES OF SERVICE *The*

term "Four Avenues of Service" is frequently used by Rotary. The "Avenues" refer to the four elements of the Object of Rotary: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service and International Service.

- *"Club Service" involves all of the activities necessary for Rotarians to perform to make their club function successfully.*
- *"Vocational Service" describes the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one's vocation to the other members of the club.*
- *"Community Service" pertains to those activities which Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. It involves assistance to youth, the aged, handicapped and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life.*
- *"International Service," describes the many programs & activities which Rotarians undertake to advance international understanding, goodwill and peace. International Service projects are designed to meet humanitarian needs of people in many lands.*

What we do!
