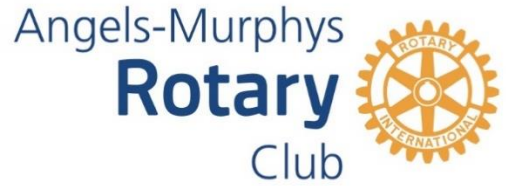

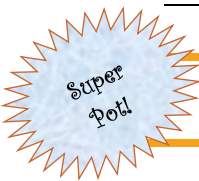
District Attorney Barbara Yook gave a very thorough presentation about the functions of the legal system and her office. She shared statistics suggesting a downward trend this year in homicides, assaults and burglaries. She explained the very complicated way a case makes its way through law enforcement, the DA, the courts and sentencing, or probation and diversion programs. Since AB 109, this whole system



has changed. An interesting fact: our county has a 40-50% show-up rate for jury duty and cases are often postponed for lack of a jury pool or available court.
