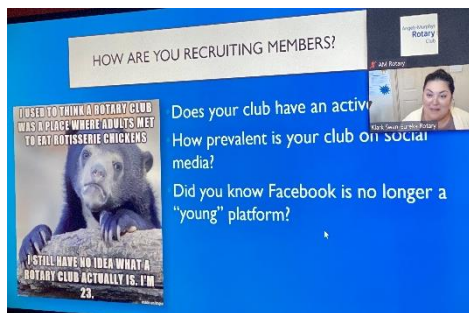
After 7 pulls, Jim finally got the ticket, but alas a green marble. ONLY 6 LEFT! Super Pot = \$640

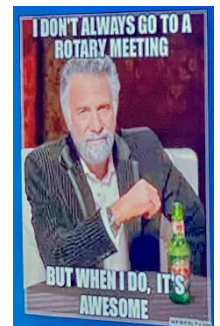
